History of our College

Barjora College (presently under Bankura University) was established in 1985 when virtually higher education was a long way off, especially to the economically backward classes of the Northern Bankura District. To cater the need of higher education a few distinguished education-lovers, dedicators and social reformers of the locality came to the forefront to realize the long-cherished dream to set up a College. After hard and unflinching struggle the distinguished personalities, also the common people of the area and a few members of the Mondal family provided land and fulfilled other necessary conditions for sanctioning the college. However, after Govt. approval this Institution was initially started in Barjora High School, later it was shifted to its own building in 1986 with a poor infrastructural facility. Gradually, it could find its own way of existence with increasing amenities in the open atmosphere of flora and fauna.

After a 'ten years pass course run' considering the growing demand of the people for extension of greater facilities of higher education emerging from the changing socio-economic conditions in the rural Northern Bankura District The University of Burdwan and concurrently the State Govt. sanctioned English Honours first in 1995. Later, Bengali Honours, History Honours, Political Science Honours and Philosophy Honours courses were introduced. Geography and Sanskrit Honours have also come into existence in this college. In this year (2023) we got two new subjects Education & Sociology from Bankura University with the commencement of NEP -2020 syllabus that diluted barriers of honours and pass courses.

The NSS wing of the college also functions very well. At present the college also offers various computer science courses under the approval of Webel. Now this Institution is firm enough to uphold and continue the educational

excellence of the students as well as to build the character and personality so that they transform into ideal citizens for the greater service of the country. With our meager resources we embark upon new ventures of outreaching to the people in our surroundings. Students are imparted with knowledge in fearless ambience of the college. CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

1. CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (CCFUGP):

New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020) for 4-years undergraduate programme(s) with "UG Degree Programmes with Single Major" only will be maintained for the academic session 2025-2026.

2. PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION:

i. Necessary advertisement for on-line admission to the Undergraduate (UG) Programme for the academic session 2023-2024 will be made by the respective undergraduate colleges of their own (Standalone mode) as per the notification issued by the Government of West Bengal (vide N.O.397- Edn(CS)/10M-95/14, dated 12 June 2023). Online admission will be made w.e.f 17/06/2023 and be completed by 01/09/2023. The colleges will provide all the information related to the admission for Undergraduate Programme along with a helpline desk (time specific) through mobile/ email in their website in this regard.

ii. The entire admission process should be made online, strictly based on merit. Prospective students should not be called for counseling or verification of documents during the process of admission. No physical presence will be required at the College / University.

iii. Documents to be uploaded by the students while filling up the online application:

- a. Admit card and Mark-sheet of Madhyamik Examination.
- b. Mark-sheet of Higher Secondary Examination.
- c. Caste Certificate (where necessary).
- d. PH Certificate (where necessary).

iv. All orders, notifications/Extant Rules issued by the Government of West Bengal including the notification vide N.O.354- Edn(CS)/10M-95/14, dated 2 June 2023 are applicable in the matters of admission and reservation rules.

3. Eligibility for the UG Programmes:

Entry requirement for 1st year 1st semester is successful completion of 10+2/ Higher Secondary(12th Grade) or equivalent stage of education from any recognized Board/Council/University.

N.B.

- i. Only Students who have passed with Mathematics as one of the subjects at the Class XII/10+2 or equivalent level are eligible for admission with major in Economics and Computer Science.
- ii. In case of equal marks in H.S. results, total marks/percentage of marks of immediately preceding examination is to be taken into account for ranking.
- iii. Best five (5) of the H.S. Subjects must be adopted for calculating the total marks and percentage.
- iv. In case wherever only Four (4) subject are offered by any recognized Board/Council etc, as the case may be in H.S or equivalent examination, first Language will be doubled to prepare the merit list on the basis of best five of H.S subjects as stated earlier.

4. Reservation of Seats:

Reservation of seats will be made as per norms of the West Bengal Government-SC (22%), ST (06%), OBC-A (10%), OBC-B (7%), EWS (10%), for differently-abled candidates 5% of each category. For differently-abled candidate minimum disability will be considered as per Government rule.

5. Session Gap:

For admission to the Under Graduate Programme (1st year, 1st semester), there should not be a gap of more than 3 years between the year of Higher Secondary / 10+2 or equivalent Examination and the year of admission to Under Graduate Programme of study i.e 2023, 2024 and 2025. In respect of calculation of marks, no deduction should be made in case of candidates passing out in previous years.

6. Intake:

The intake capacity will be notified by the respective colleges as sanctioned by the appropriate authority.

The Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry (APAAR)

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS, a specialist identification system, is meant to be used by all Indian students. Part of the Union government's 'One Nation, One Student ID' campaign, this endeavour is in line with the recently implemented National Education Policy of 2020. All Indian students must register for **APAAR/ABC ID**, a unique 12-digit code, in order to digitally preserve, manage, and access all of their academic credits—including degrees, diplomas, certificates, training details, and extracurricular accomplishments. In the context of education, this ID acts as a digital identification for the student. Using their **APAAR/ABC ID** as a link, students can securely save critical documents, such as test results, in DigiLocker, an online repository. It is linked to the Academic Bank of Credits (**ABC**) by the **APAAR/ABC ID** and accepts academic credits from institutions via the National Academic Depository. This expedites authentication for employment applications or admissions and makes it easier to verify academic records. In order to increase accountability and transparency in education, **APAAR** monitors student accomplishment and simplifies academic data. It provides a comprehensive approach to student development by enhancing productivity, combating fraud, and including extracurricular activities. **APAAR** facilitates data-driven decision making in educational institutions and expedites the transfer process through a range of applications. It also facilitates the easy sharing of academic data among students, so expanding their options. **APAAR** facilitates career development, provides academic material that is insightful, expedites administrative processes, and forges relationships with industry partners in higher education. Along with stream lining administrative duties like record keeping and admissions, it also helps create links between students and employers and offers individualised career guidance. Colleges trust **APAAR/ABC ID** to handle the

details so they may focus on creating settings that support growth in both the professional and academic domains. Following UGC's advice, the BANKURA UNIVERSITY took the initiative to establish academic banks of credit for each and every undergraduate student. The college administration delegated authority to the relevant nodal personnel to assist our students in obtaining their Academic Bank of credits, and they completed the task successfully and on schedule. Before registration, the university made it essential for every single student. The ability for students to store their documents in a free, centrally secured DigiLocker will be greatly aided by this accomplishment. Most of the college's students have created their ABC IDs and registered for Digilockers thus far.

EXAMINATION CREDIT SYSTEM IN NEP-2020

As per New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate (UG) Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020), the Undergraduate Degree Programmes are of either 3 or 4-year durations, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as :

- i. A UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that a vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 40 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.
- ii. A UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study provided that a vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 82 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

iii. A bachelor's degree after a 3-year (6 semesters) programme of study.

iv. A 4-year bachelor's degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 semesters) programme of study. If the student completes a rigorous research project in their major area(s) of study in the 4 year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research).

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Code of Conduct for Students

Discipline

The Principal invites the co-operation of the students and their guardians in the creation and the maintenance of an atmosphere conducive to academic and cultural development, and in upholding the traditions of the institution. Students are especially invited to cooperate, in their own interest with their elected Class Representative to ensure enforcement of rules regarding discipline

[A] BEHAVIOURAL DISCIPLINE - DO'S AND DONT'S IN CLASSROOM AND COLLEGE PREMISES

1.Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes, tutorials, class tests examinations etc. Failure to obtain the required attendance percentage, non-submission of assignments and unjustified absence from tests /examinations will be treated as breaching the code of conduct.

2.Students must be seated in their classrooms at the beginning of each period. They must not enter or leave the class room without permission of the lecturer.

3. Impersonation during roll call is a punishable offence.

4. Use of Mobile Phone during class hours is prohibited and is liable for punishment.

5. Resorting to any kind of malpractice (copying, impersonation, use of unfair means, exchanging answer-sheets) during examinations will not be tolerated and will be dealt with severely.

6. Students should carefully follow the Notices put up on the Notice Board (both online and offline). No excuse will be considered if Notices on the Board are ignored.
7. When a lecturer is absent or is unable to take class, students should maintain a strict order among themselves so as to not disturb the adjoining classes. Under no circumstances should they leave the classroom without ascertaining the relieve orders from the Staff room.
8. Students are expected to treat the members of the staff both teaching and non teaching and their fellow students with courtesy both in and outside the College. Students shall not, by their act or conduct, cause damage to the reputation of the institution.
9. Students are expected to come to College dressed suitably maintaining decency.
10. Students must wear and display visibly their Identity Cards at the gate while entering the College and always keep it on your person during College hours inside the campus.
11. Students are not allowed to loiter or stand about the verandas or corridors of the College during class hours.
12. When assembled every class must consider itself responsible for the conduct of its members.
13. Students are forbidden from inviting friends from other institutions and outsiders to the College.
14. No posters are to be pasted or fixed with cellotape anywhere on the College walls. Any writing, scribbling on the walls will attract disciplinary measures against the student.
15. Smoking, chewing and spitting tobacco products or pan masala, consumption of alcohol or narcotic drugs is strictly prohibited inside the college premises. Violation of this rule will invite disciplinary action. The college premises is a smoking free zone, respect it.
16. Students must refrain from mishandling and tampering with library books or college computer systems.
17. The right to access Girl's Common Room is reserved to girls.

18. A student shall not commit or cause breach of peace inside and around the College campus.

19. Students are prohibited from indulging in games, even in small groups, anywhere in the College premises during lecture hours.

20. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate this rule. It is mandatory for all students and guardians to sign an affidavit in the pro forma prescribed by the University of Calcutta related to ragging. **N. B.**

1-Any damage or defacement of college property is a punishable offence. If a college property is found damaged in a classroom while the class is assembled the loss may be recovered by a fee imposing upon the whole class if the students responsible for such damage cannot be detected.

2-Habitual misconduct/repeated breach of the College Rules & Regulation will be considered as a grave offence and will result in suspension/expulsion of the student with immediate effect.

[B] ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Academic integrity refers to an essential quality that an institution must uphold to fulfill its academic objective and research mission, and hence its violation constitutes a serious offence. The principles of academic integrity form an integral part of the code of conduct to which all the students of the institution must adhere. Breach of this code puts into question both the reputation of the Institution and the value of the degree awarded to the students. Every pupil of the Institution should be responsible to ensure the highest quality of the academic integrity.

[C] ANTI-RAGGING

The Institution implemented a strict and effective anti-ragging policy based on the UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institution, 2009. This UGC Regulation was framed in accordance with the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India to prevent and prohibit ragging in all Indian Educational Institutions and Colleges.

Ragging constitutes one or more of the following acts: (a) Any conduct by any student or group of students –whether through spoken or written words or physical act-which has the effect of fearing or misbehaving any student, (b) Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in ordinary course do and thereby causes shame, annoyance, torment, hardship, embarrassment which inflict intense psychological harm or raise fear or apprehension in any student. (c) Any act by senior students that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any student. (d) Any act of financial extortion put on any student. (f) Any act of physical abuse including sexual abuse, stripping, forcing in lewd acts or gestures causing bodily harm to any student. (g) Any act of verbal or written abuse such as calling foul names, insulting publicly, offensive emails which embarrass, annoy and discomfort any student.

Anti-ragging Committee: This committee shall examine all complaints of anti-ragging and come out with recommendations based on the nature of the incident and proper investigation.

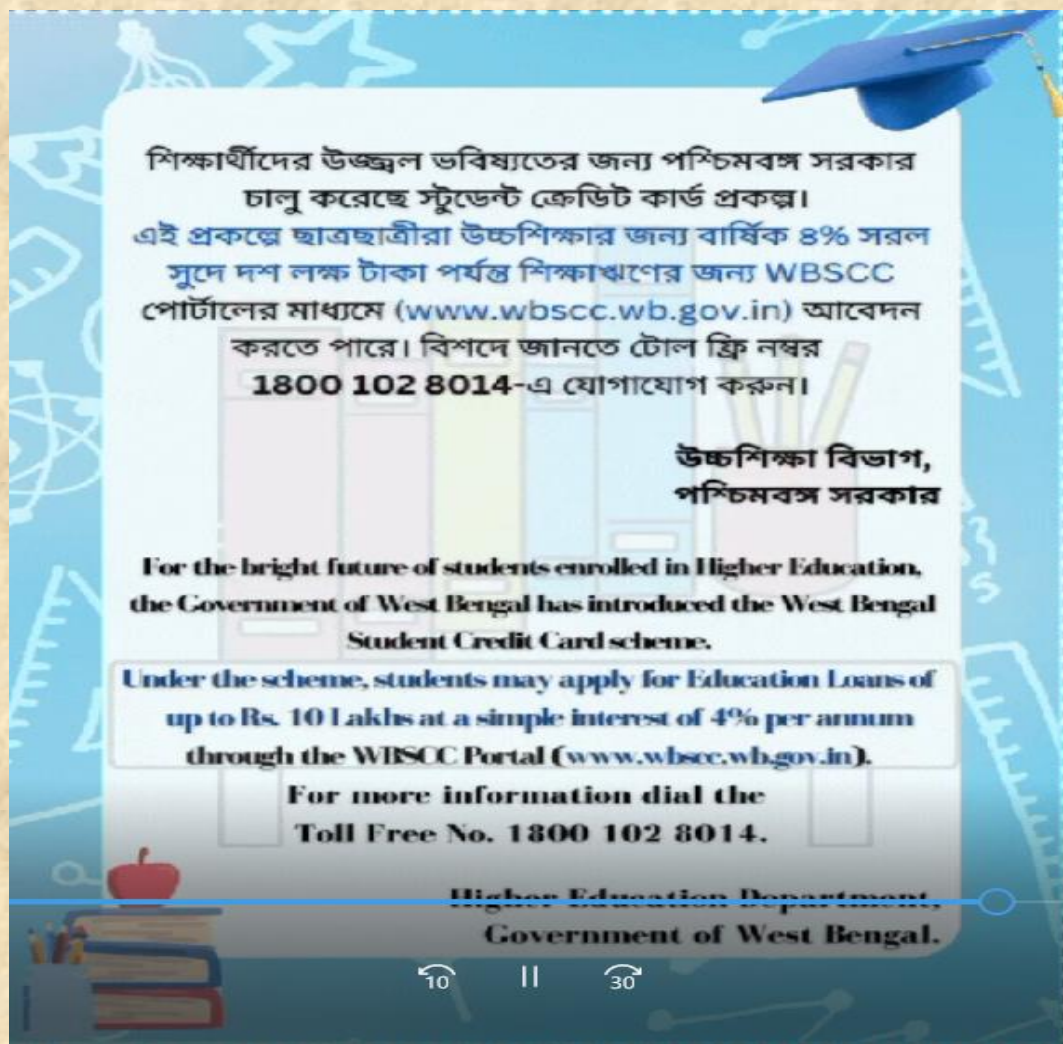
PUNITARY MEASURES AGAINST THE ACT OF RAGGING:

A student or group of students found guilty by the anti-ragging committee will attract one or more of the following punitive actions by the college authority:

- a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- b) Withholding / withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
- c) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- d) Withholding results.
- e) Cancellation of examination.
- f) Expulsion from a specified institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- g) If need be, in view of the intensity of the act of ragging committed, a First Information Report (FIR) shall be filed by the Institute with the local police authorities. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institute shall take appropriate decision, including imposition of punishment, depending on the facts and circumstances of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging.

WEST BENGAL STUDENT CREDIT CARD SCHEME

The Student Credit Card Scheme, launched by the West Bengal government's higher education department, enables students to take a soft loan of up to Rs. 10 lakh for higher studies.

WHO IS IT FOR?

The Student Credit Card Scheme is designed to support students who want to pursue secondary, higher secondary, undergraduate, and postgraduate studies. These include professional degrees and other equivalent courses in any school, madrasa, college, university, or any other affiliated institutes within as well as outside India. Students studying in various coaching institutions can also avail themselves of a loan to appear in competitive examinations such as engineering, medical, law and civil services examinations.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Applicants seeking a loan under the scheme must be Indian nationals and residents of West Bengal for the past 10 years and bonafide students of the respective institutions. Students from Class X to those up to 40 years of age are eligible to apply for the scheme.

LOAN AMOUNT & INTEREST RATE

A student can get a soft loan of up to Rs 10 lakh at a simple interest of 4% per annum from the State Cooperative Bank, its affiliated Central Cooperative Banks, District Central Cooperative Banks and public/ private sector banks.

HOW AND WHEN TO REPAY ?

The repayment period for any loan availed under this credit card will be 15 years, including the moratorium/ repayment holiday. The student or a parent/ legal guardian can repay the loan amount any time before the stipulated period of repayment. There will be no penalty or processing fee in case of early repayment. The borrower will get a 1% concession in interest if they have fully used the interest during their study period.
